

PUPIL PREMIUM

In 2011-12 the Government launched its Pupil Premium funding. This money is sent to schools based on the numbers of pupils in the school who are eligible for Free School Meals.

This money is allocated to initiatives to ensure pupils reach their full potential, both academically and socially.

In 2011-12 the school received £11 180 in Pupil Premium funding. This money was used to help provide for the following initiatives:-

IMPACT <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Attendance for the whole school in the 2011/2012 academic year was 95:6% up 0:76% on the previous year. 2. The combined attendance of the Year 6 pupils who were eligible for FSM during 2011/2012 was above the school average in both 2010/2011 and 2011/2012. 3. The school's overall performance in the KS2 SATs in 2012 showed significant improvement on previous years. 4. All the Year 6 pupils who were eligible for FSM during 2011/2012 achieved 2 levels progress in Reading, Writing & Maths between KS1 and KS2. Half of these achieved 3 levels progress in Maths. 	

In 2012-13 the school will receive £23,400 of Pupil Premium Funding. (This increase is due to the funding now being calculated based on the numbers of children who have been eligible for FSM in the last 6 years.)

Expenditure in 2012/2013 will continue to focus on the areas outlined above as these have been shown to impact on positively in terms of academic achievement and the social development of the children concerned.
